#### 2.3. Other hazards which do not result in classification

Other hazards not contributing to the classification : This product contains greater than 0.1% by weight titanium dioxide. Titanium dioxide inhalation studies in rats indicate that there is sufficient evidence that inhalation of excessive amounts of titanium dioxide is carcinogenic in the lungs of experimental animals. Titanium dioxide is classified as "Group 2B (possibly carcinogenic to humans)" by IARC. Titanium dioxide is in a form that is not available for respiration.
